He is one of the maintainers of the Collection of Open Science Integrity Guides (COSIG, cosig.net), an open-source resource for performing post-publication peer review.

Scholarships and Grants

The Wisconsin League for Nursing (WLN) Scholarships and Grants Committee remains committed to our mission, which is impacting the lifelong learning of nurses in diverse environments. To achieve this, the dedicated members of the Scholarships and Grants Committee actively seek grants which provide scholarship support for Wisconsin nursing students.

Our scholarships have different eligibility criteria, clearly communicated in the application. To begin with, the applicant must be a Wisconsin student currently enrolled in a Wisconsin school of nursing. The Scholarships and Grants Committee screen the submitted applications to be sure the criteria are met and then reviews them to select one that best addresses the specific details of the scholarship. The scholarship winners are announced and presented at the WLN fall conference and are awarded as monies are available. Currently we offer seven scholarships provided by the very generous and long-time support of the Deaconess Alumni Association. The application criteria vary for each scholarship and are available for every level of nursing education. In addition, we are pleased to provide two additional scholarships each year. One is entitled "The Ruth Seris Gresley Scholarship." It honors the memory of Ruth Seris Gresley who was a beloved and influential nurse educator for over 45 years. This scholarship is sponsored by John Gresley, and others who loved and respected Ruth with a current balance of \$14,986.37. Finally, the WLN sponsors the "Nursing Heroes Scholarship" to honor Wisconsin nurses who died due to COVID-19. This fund is actively seeking donations to help it become self-sustaining. Currently the "Nursing Heroes Scholarship" has a balance of \$4,821.52. The Ruth Seris Gresley and Nursing Heroes funds are managed by the Waukesha County Community Foundation (WCCF).

We began accepting scholarship applications in August for the current round of scholarships to be disbursed at the Fall conference in November. The WLN website has an area specific to Scholarships for future reference; here you will find scholarship criteria, updates, and opportunities. Online applications are made directly through a link found on the WLN website. If you have questions, please feel free to contact Dr. Christine Laurent at cpl Laurent58@marianuniversity.edu.

This year we submitted a grant application to Bader Philanthropies, Inc. The primary objective of this grant is to financially support, in part, the successful completion of an advanced practice nursing degree from qualified applicants. The applicants will be nurses who serve the special needs of the elderly population, with a focus on strategies that help older adults and Alzheimer's patients improve and maintain a good quality of life. Four scholarships of \$5,000 will be disbursed in Spring 2026, and four more are planned to be disbursed in Spring of 2027. Details about applying for these scholarships will be available on the WLN website soon.

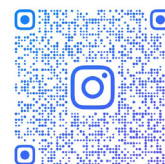


MARKETING UPDATE

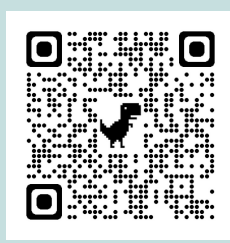

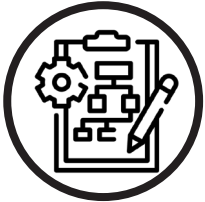

CROCKPOT LASAGNA SOUP



"This hearty, saucy crockpot lasagna soup feeds the whole family and then some," says recipe developer Amanda Stanfield. "Rich tomato broth with lasagna sheets and fresh spinach are topped with a dollop of ricotta cheese. The perfect comfort food."

Prep Time: 10 mins
Cook Time: 2 hrs 40 mins
Servings: 10

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 1/2 pounds 93/7 lean ground beef
- 1 1/2 cups finely chopped yellow onion
- 6 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 1/2 teaspoons table salt, divided
- 3/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper, divided
- 6 cups beef broth
- 1 (24-ounce) jar marinara sauce (such as Rao's)
- 1 (15-ounce) can diced tomatoes, drained
- 1 (6-ounce) can basil, garlic, and oregano tomato paste
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper, plus more for garnish
- 8 ounces uncooked lasagna noodles, broken into 1 3/4-inch pieces (About 8 to 9 sheets)
- 2 cups fresh baby spinach, chopped
- 1 (15-ounce) container whole milk ricotta cheese
- freshly grated Parmesan cheese, to taste

DIRECTIONS

1. **Gather** all ingredients.
2. **Combine** ground beef, onion, garlic, 1/2 teaspoon salt, and 1/2 teaspoon black pepper in a large nonstick skillet over medium-high. Cook, stirring occasionally, until beef is no longer pink and onions are softened, about 8 minutes. Transfer to a 6-quart slow cooker.
3. **Stir** in broth, marinara sauce, diced tomatoes, tomato paste, crushed red pepper, remaining 1 teaspoon salt, and remaining 1/4 teaspoon black pepper until combined.
4. **Cover and cook** on LOW until soup is just slightly thickened, 3 1/2 to 4 hours, or on HIGH for 2 hours.
5. **Stir** lasagna noodles into crockpot until sheets are submerged in liquid.
6. **Cover and cook** on HIGH until pasta is al dente, about 30 minutes.
7. **Stirring** in spinach the last 5 minutes of cooking.
8. **Serve** with a dollop of ricotta and Parmesan cheese. Garnish with crushed red pepper.

HARVESTING GROWTH: LESSONS FOR NURSING EDUCATORS IN THE SEASON OF CHANGE



“Small shifts in your thinking, and small changes in your energy, can lead to massive alterations of your end result.” – Kevin Michel

As the leaves turn and the air grows crisper, autumn offers a quiet reminder: change is a natural—and beautiful—part of life. For nursing educators and staff development professionals, this season can become a powerful metaphor for growth, reflection, and renewal.

Fall often brings a packed schedule and fewer moments to pause. As nurses and educators, we juggle curriculum planning, student mentoring, competency assessments, and outcomes tracking. Staff development leaders share similar burdens, working tirelessly to support both new and seasoned nurses. Yet even amid the busiest times, self-care must remain a foundation.
